Communication, Language and Literacy Books: Rapunzel, Alfie gets in first, Lost and found Write own name. Write labels. Identify initial sounds. Begin to read and write CVC words. Retell stories orally. Begin to read some common high frequency words. Recite rhymes and continue a rhyming string.
