



Science - African animals



The African penguin, also known as the Cape penguin, and South African penguin, is a species of penguin confined to southern African waters. Like all penguins, it is flightless.



The giraffe is an African artiodactyl mammal, the tallest living terrestrial animal.



The Cape cobra, also called the yellow cobra, is a moderate-sized, highly venomous species of cobra inhabiting a wide variety of biomes across southern Africa including arid savannah, desert and semi-desert regions



The brown banana frog, also known as the striped spiny reed frog. It is an amphibian.



The Cape needlefish is a species of needlefish found in waters around South Africa. This species grows to a standard length of 35 cm

Key Vocabulary

Habitat – A habitat is a home for an animal or plant.

Carnivore – A carnivore is an animal that eats meat.

Herbivore – A herbivore is an animal that eats plants.

Omnivore – An omnivore is an animal that eats both meat and plants.

Reptile – Is a cold blooded animals that has scales or bony plates. They lay eggs on land.

Bird - They have a backbone, have feathers and lay eggs.

Amphibian – They lay their eggs in water, and can live on land and in the water.

Mammal – They are warm blooded and have fur or hair. They give birth to live babies.

Fish - a limbless cold-blooded animal with gills and fins living wholly in water.

Humid – it will be very hot and wet, like a swimming pool.

Arid – very dry

Equator - is an imaginary circle around Earth. It divides Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.
