

Eling Tide Mill - a mill with a waterwheel driven by the tide.

Pond - a small body of still water formed.

Boardwalk - a wooden walkway across sand or marshy ground.

River - a large natural stream of water flowing to the sea, a lake, or another river.

Forest - a large area covered mainly with trees and undergrowth.

Sea -the expanse of salt water that covers most of the earth's surface and surrounds its land masses.

Coast - the part of the land near the sea.

Beach - a pebbly or sandy shore, especially by the sea between high and low tide.

Harbour - a place on the coast where ships may moor in shelter

Habitat - a habitat is a home for an animal or plant.

Carnivore - a carnivore is an animal that eats meat.

Herbivore - a herbivore is an animal that eats plants.

Omnivore – an omnivore is an animal that eats both meat and plants.

Reptile – a cold-blooded animal that has scales or bony plates. They lay eggs on land.

Bird- they have a backbone, have feathers and lay eggs.

Amphibian - they lay their eggs in water, and can live on land and in the water.

Mammal – they are warm-blooded and have fur or hair. They give birth to live babies.

Fish - a limbless, cold-blooded animal with gills and fins living wholly in water.
