Important People

Queen Victoria



- Queen Victoria was born on 24 May 1819 in Kensington Palace in London, England.
- Victoria became Queen of England in June 1837, when she was just 18 years old. Her coronation took place at Westminster Abbey a year later in June 1838, where everyone cheered "Long live the Queen!"
- Queen Victoria died in January 1901, aged 81.

Queen Elizabeth II



- Queen Elizabeth II was born at 2.40am on 21 April 1926.
- She was crowned Queen on 2 June 1953.
- Her reign ended on 8 September 2022, when she passed away peacefully at Balmoral Castle, Scotland, and her son, King Charles III, was crowned.
- She was the longest reigning monarch ever in Britain, beating even Queen Victoria (her great-greatgrandma!).


King Charles III



- King Charles III was born at 9.14pm on 14 November 1948.
- He became King on 8 September 2022.
- The King's Coronation will take place on 6th May 2023 at Westminster Abbey.
